

## HEAL 1 Update

In March, the United Health Services Hospitals McKesson Picture Archiving and Communication System (PACS) system was integrated into the Southern Tier HealthLink New York (STHLNY) portal, as well as Our Lady of Lourdes Emageon PACS system. Rich PACS data from UHSH and OLL is now being populated in the STHLNy Health Information Exchange (HIE).

Currently, a pilot group of providers is trying out the UHSH NextGen electronic medical record interoperability with the STHLNy HIE in a production environment. Their feedback will be incorporated to create smooth workflows and a positive user experience.

As the pilot progresses workflow issues will be straightened out until a degree of comfort has been established to allow for a wider pilot by June 2009. Patient consent activities will begin in May.

## HEAL 5 Update

We continue to await our contract from New York State, which appears imminent. Work is progressing on patient and provider communication pieces. We are positioned to "hit the ground running" as soon as the contract arrives.
